MSN Program Overview

At Florida Southern College, our MSN program builds on the foundations of the BSN and allows students to focus on a specific area of advanced nursing.

Our MSN program currently features four distinct curriculum tracks: Family Nurse Practitioner, Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner, Nurse Educator, and Nursing Administrative Leadership.

Family Nurse Practitioner Track Delivery

Family Nurse Practitioner students meet on campus one day per week for in-person classroom instruction. The curriculum is designed to be completed in six semesters. Actual time to degree completion may vary for individual students.

Academic Advisor

Admission Requirements

- · Completed online application
- · Official transcripts of all academic work
- Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) from an accredited CNEA, ACEN or CCNE program at a regionally accredited college or university
- Current résumé
- Minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale on the last 60 hours of undergraduate coursework
- Required undergraduate prerequisite courses
- Proof of current active licensure as a registered nurse in the state of Florida
- Record and submit three short videos (no more than 2 minutes each) answering the following prompts:
 - 1. Where do you see yourself in five years as a nurse practitioner, nurse leader, or nurse educator?
 - 2. Why is now the right time for you to begin a graduate nursing program?
 - 3. Graduate school will put significant demands on your time, energy, and financial resources. What do you see as your most significant challenges for meeting the didactic and clinical requirements for the program?
- Personal interview may be required for eligible candidates

Completion of a criminal background check, proof of immunization, and a ten-panel drug screen prior to beginning the program (if admitted)
