Biographical Sketch:

Sue Stanley-Green was born December 16, 1956 in Wooster, Ohio. She grew up in nearby Smithville, Ohio and graduated from high school in 1975. She attended Ohio State University where her original plan was to become a physician. However, while there, she discovered the university's athletic training program and switched her career path. She graduated in 1979 with her Bachelor of Science in Physical Education and went on to earn her Master of Science in Exercise Science from Purdue University in 1981. She began her career in athletic training by working at East Carolina State University, but in 1982, she departed the school for the University of Kentucky where Albert "Al" Green had hired her as both an Assistant Athletic Trainer and an Instructor. She worked for the University of Kentucky for 15 years and was the first female full-time athletic trainer for football in the Southeastern Conference (SEC). From 1988 to 1993, Stanley-Green also worked on various assignments for the United States Olympic Committee as an athletic trainer. After years of working together as a team, she and Al Green married in 1993. The two continued to work as a team until 1997 when they both departed the University of Kentucky. From 1998 to 1999, Stanley-Green served as the Head Athletic Trainer at Centre College in Danville, Kentucky.

In the fall of 1999, Sue Stanley-Green, MS, ATC was hired to serve as the Clinical Education Coordinator for the Athletic Training Education Program (ATEP) at Florida Southern College. In 2002, she was appointed the Athletic Education Training Program Director. Stanley-Green also served as a clinical instructor and faculty member for the College, teaching classes for ATEP as well as co-teaching a Women's Studies class. In 2004, she was inducted into the National Athletic Trainers' Association (NATA) Hall of Fame, alongside her husband. They were their first wife-husband team to be inducted. In 2006, she returned to working alongside her husband as they both served as athletic trainers for the Lakeland Thunderbolts indoor football team. In 2007, Al Green joined his wife at Florida Southern as the Assistant Athletic Director and Head Athletic Trainer. Sue Stanley-Green retired in 2019 alongside her last cohort of ATEP students, and the Program itself officially ended in May 2020.

Scope & Content Note:

The Sue Stanley-Green Faculty Papers contains documents pertaining to her role as Program Director of the Athletic Training Education Program and as a faculty member of Florida Southern College. The collection provides insight into the activities of a faculty member at Florida Southern College. It has been arranged into series alphabetically by topic.

The **Activity Reports**, contain the annual reports Sue Stanley-Green submitted to her supervisor detailing her professional activities over the past year as well as areas to improve and goals for the upcoming academic year. Initially, the dates for these reports follow the calendar year (January to December) rather than the academic calendar. Starting in 2010, however, the report dates are based on academic year.

The **Awards** consist of recognitions that Sue Stanley-Green received. Included are both the physical certificates she received as well as event pamphlets from the award ceremonies.

The series **Committee Work** contains documents related to the committees that Sue Stanley-Green participated in to fulfill the campus expectation that faculty members serve on various committees. Over the years, Sue Stanley-Green was part of the Curriculum Committee, the Faculty Professional Interests Committee as well as committees concerning SACS accreditation and internships.

The **Correspondence** contains letters and emails written and received by Sue Stanley-Green.

Courses includes material from the courses taught by Stanley-Green that were not part of the core classes for ATEP. For information on classes that she taught as part of ATEP, please see the *FSC Athletic Training Education Program Records* collection.

The **Faculty Meetings** contain Stanley-Green's notes and handouts from Florida Southern College's general faculty meetings.

The **Presentations and Publications** are divided into three sub series. *Presentations* consists of presentations given by Sue Stanley-Green; *Publications* contains articles written by her; and *Research Projects* include materials from projects completed at Florida Southern College with fellow ATEP faculty member Dr. James "Mick" Lynch.

The **Press** series contains newspaper and magazine articles published about Sue Stanley-Green as well as her professional partnership with her husband Al Green.

The **Professional Development** series is divided into two sub series. *Athletic Training Services* files contain information about the athletic training services Stanley-Green provided for local organizations outside of FSC. And *Continuing Education Credits* includes records of the continuing education credits undertaken by Stanley-Green to remain certified in the state of Florida, every two years.

The **Teaching Philosophy** series contains materials related to the development of Stanley-Green's teaching philosophy and its development.
