Florida Southern College's Master of Education (MEd) in Educational Leadership program is offered to educators who currently hold a Florida Professional Teaching Certificate. This program is designed for educators who wish to advance their career in P-12 administration.

Accelerated Program

The MEd in Educational Leadership program is offered in an accelerated format that will allow you to complete the program in as few as five semesters.

Financial Aid

Tuition deferment is available to students receiving employer reimbursement. FSC participates in all major federal aid programs including military funding.

Teachers employed by Polk County Public Schools who host a Florida Southern College education student for internship earn a voucher for one free Florida Southern College School of Education course up to four credits. There is no limit to the number of vouchers you can earn; however, they are nontransferable. Vouchers may be applied to any School of Education course offered and may be used toward the completion of a degree program. Vouchers expire three years after the award date.

Admission Requirements

- · Completed online application
- · Valid Florida Professional Teaching Certificate
- FLDOE Leadership Potential Form completed by supervisor verifying critical skills and dispositions
- Documentation of instructional expertise in the form of two most recent performance evaluations. These evaluations must indicate a rating of "effective" or higher on the "Performance of Students" and "Instructional Practice" sections.
- Applicants must have an earned baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education as verified by an official transcript with at least a cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Applicants with a GPA lower than a 3.0 must submit a minimum GRE composite score of 297
- Résumé or CV of educational and work experience
- Personal statement of your expectations of a graduate program to include personal and professional goals
