Financial Aid

Tuition deferment is available to students receiving employer reimbursement. FSC participates in all major federal aid programs including military funding.

Teachers employed by Polk County Public Schools who host a Florida Southern College education student for internship earn a voucher for one free Florida Southern College School of Education course up to four credits. There is no limit to the number of vouchers you can earn; however, they are nontransferable. Vouchers may be applied to any School of Education course offered and may be used toward the completion of a degree program.

Admission Requirements

- Completed online application
- An earned baccalaureate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education as verified by an official transcript of conferring institution
- An earned graduate degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher education as verified by an official transcript of conferring institution
- Earned grade point average of at least a 3.0 on a four-point scale in an accredited master's degree program
- Copy of Florida Professional Teaching Certificate or Master of Education degree
- Official Graduate Record Exam (GRE) scores taken within the last five years (exempt if GPA is over 3.0)
- One letter of recommendation
- · Résumé or CV of educational and work experience
- Personal statement of your expectations of a doctorate program to include personal and professional goals
- Personal interview
