Program Requirements

Students who have earned an Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree from a regionally accredited institution in Florida will have met all General Education requirements and may earn up to 62 credit hours toward their degree.

For students who have earned an Associate of Science (A.S.) degree, a maximum of 62 credit hours from a regionally accredited institution may be applied to the degree.

If an A.A. was not earned at another institution prior to matriculation at Florida Southern, general education requirements are awarded on a course-by-course equivalency.

Financial Aid

Admission Requirements

- Completed online application
- Provide official transcripts of all academic work taken previously at other colleges, universities, or professional schools.
- If fewer than 25 credit hours have been earned from a regionally accredited college or university, student should provide official high school transcript or GED scores, as well as ACT or SAT exam scores, OR as an alternative, applicants should instead submit an updated resume and elect to apply through the test-optional policy.
- Military service-connected, educational experiences may award transfer credits. Requests should be accompanied by documents describing the educational experience. (Seven semester hours of credit may be awarded.)
